Welcome to the spring 2024 edition of the Wards 2 & 6 community newsletter! We are pleased to share community events, initiatives and upcoming news with you.

We ended 2023 with optimism for a productive new year and so far, 2024 is off to a running start. In between Council meetings, we have been connecting with residents, supporting initiatives in Wards 2 & 6 and advocating to our provincial and federal partners for a better Brampton.

The beginning of this year has been eventful for sports fans across Brampton. Hockey fans rejoiced when the Stanley Cup came to Brampton during the Celebrate Hockey Community Skate. Residents had the chance to take a picture with the Stanley Cup, discover the NHL United Mobile Hockey Museum and meet the hosts of Hockey Night in Canada Punjabi.

The City also hosted an important snow removal telephone town hall to receive feedback from residents about current snow removal services and which additional services they would like to see.

This past November, we hosted a Community Safety and Budget Town Hall where residents had the opportunity to bring their voices to the table. Rising auto thefts and traffic infractions were the two greatest concerns raised. The installation of 100 more ASE cameras and 50 traffic cameras at priority intersections are key ways that the City is tackling traffic issues. Peel Regional Police has dedicated auto theft task forces that are cracking down on theft rings and tracking down stolen vehicles. Brampton representatives also pushed for workable solutions to combat auto theft at the National Auto Theft Summit in Ottawa.

Spring is in full swing and our parks and green spaces are as busy as ever. We encourage residents to let us know how we can improve and beautify the parks across Wards 2 & 6. Residents can also organize a self-led cleanup of a park or trail with the help of City staff and organizations like People Against Littering (P.A.L.). We look forward to joining the community cleanups, which will be taking place over the next couple of months and encourage you to reach out about any community cleanups you wish to organize.

Thank you for your continued support and engagement! The Wards 2 & 6 team looks forward to working for you and with you to meet your needs and address your concerns. We welcome you to reach out to our offices.

Beginning June 2024, Brampton residents ages 70+ can access free recreation programs and services. Visit any recreation centre to complete the verification process and sign up for a free annual membership. Membership holders can enjoy free fitness memberships, registered and drop-in programs and more! Residents must provide a proof of Brampton residency, identity and age and Canadian citizenship or permanent residency at the time of signup. Eligibility will be reconfirmed every year. Earlier this year, the City unveiled the latest addition to the Brampton Fire and Emergency Services fleet – the Rosenbauer RTX, the first electric-powered fire truck in Brampton! The Rosenbauer RTX's advanced technology allows our fire crews to respond to emergencies with zero emissions, both on the road and on-site. Brampton is set to become the first municipality in Ontario to deploy an electric-powered front-line emergency response vehicle. Feeding Wildlife is Prohibited

Under the Animal Services By-Law, feeding wildlife is prohibited in Brampton. Store your garbage, green bin and recycling boxes inside a garage, shed or away from fences/rails that can be easily climbed by animals. Place your garbage out for collection only on the scheduled day of pick up, no later than 7 am.



Fire Safety Tips

Brampton Fire and Emergency Services wants to help ensure Brampton residents protect their home, loved ones and spring memories from the impacts of fire. Make sure to:

- Install working smoke and carbon monoxide alarms.
- Create a home escape plan with your family.
- Stay in the kitchen while cooking.
- Only use barbecue grills outdoors, positioned away from combustible objects.

Spring Street Sweeping

During spring sweeping, crews clear salt, sand and debris accumulated over the winter on all streets, boulevards, parking lots and sidewalks to keep Brampton clean and green. - Do keep sidewalks clear.

We hosted a successful Wards 2 & 6 Community Safety Town Hall and Budget Chat with Mayor Patrick Brown at Grace Reformed Church. We had great support from City staff from Snow Removal Operations, Traffic Operations, our Community Safety & Well-being Office and our Finance team who fielded resident questions and presented information in an engaging manner. Peel Regional Police officers also addressed the main community concerns of traffic infractions, auto theft and advised residents about crime prevention. In addition to addressing resident concerns, Mayor Brown and our Finance team informed residents about both municipal and regional budget allocations that support solutions to these pressing issues, including investing in more uniformed officers and civilian staff at Peel Regional Police.
