Dear Friends,

As your Regional Councillors, we're happy to provide you with a robust update on our continuous commitment to serve the residents of this great city, and work towards achieving our corporate strategic priorities, both at the City of Brampton and the Region of Peel.

The 2024 Budgets were approved for the Region of Peel and City of Brampton. Highlights from the **Regional Budget** include: 135 new Peel Regional Police officers, 96 new civilian staff, 10 cadets, 36 new paramedics, three new 24/7 ambulances, \$5.4M investment in housing subsidy and wrap around supports, \$2M in funding for food banks, a \$6.5M investment in our homelessness and mobile outreach teams, continuing to implement the Canada-Wide Early Learning and Child Care plan, with an increase of \$60.6 million to expand the affordability program of lowering child care fees. The budget also reflects \$9M in cost savings and avoidance found through improvement efforts and containment measures.

At the City of Brampton, the 2024 Budget supports the needs of a growing population while making record contributions to reserves and priority investments in infrastructure, transportation, recreational amenities, health care and community safety. The 2024 Budget delivers a tax increase of 1.9% on the City portion of the tax bill, which is well below inflation and the lowest in the GTA.

Highlights from the **City Budget** include: the largest ever annual contribution to reserves at \$139M - focusing on Brampton's infrastructure, the continuation of a 1% hospital levy to support the construction of a second hospital for Brampton and a new cancer care centre, 136 new transit operators, \$87.3M towards flood With **street safety** as a key priority, we also approved \$5.15M for city-wide traffic calming measures to implement speed deterrents such as speed cushions and pedestrian crossovers. The City also installed 50 Automated Speed Enforcement (ASE) cameras, established 180 Community Safety Zones and implemented the Neighbourhood Speed Safety Zones Pilot Project.

In December, the Province of Ontario announced they will **not be moving forward with dissolving the Region of Peel**, which would have made Brampton, Mississauga, and Caledon three single-tier cities. This is great news for our city, as financial burdens and maintaining essential services were key concerns evolving from the dissolution.


The City's Community Safety & Well-Being Office has also launched a **Neighbourhood Association Guide**. The guide shares information on capacity building and establishing a community network to address and overcome safety concerns in neighbourhoods. Groups can apply to become an Affiliated Neighbourhood Association, with the possibility of a grant of up to \$1,500 to support neighbourhood projects.

New! Free Recreation Membership for Seniors

Beginning June 2024, Brampton residents ages 70+ can access free recreation programs and services. Visit any recreation centre to complete the verification process and sign up for a free annual membership. Membership holders can enjoy free fitness memberships, registered and drop-in programs and more! Residents must provide a proof of Brampton residency, identity and age and Canadian citizenship or permanent residency at the time of signup. Eligibility will be reconfirmed every year. Work Underway at Zero Net Carbon Retrofit Project

Construction began this spring at Susan Fennell Sportsplex to retrofit the space into a zero-carbon facility, which will serve as a model for municipalities across Canada. Retrofits include electrifying all gas-powered equipment, installing a geothermal system, replacing ice rink refrigeration plants, air handling units, heat pumps, installing a rooftop Solar PV system and more. The retrofits will reduce annual greenhouse gas emissions by 91 per cent. Funding for this project includes a \$15.7 million Federal Green and Inclusive Community Buildings grant and \$10 million in funding through the Green Municipal Fund's Community Buildings Retrofit initiative. Downtown Brampton LRT Extension

The Hazel McCallion LRT will bring 18 kilometres of fast, reliable, rapid transit along the Hurontario corridor between the Brampton Gateway Terminal at Steeles Avenue in Brampton and the Port Credit GO Station in Mississauga. Brampton City Council has unanimously endorsed the tunnel alignment for the LRT extension into downtown Brampton and earlier this year, approved advancing the tunnel alignment through the Transit Project Assessment Process. The City continues to advocate to both the provincial and federal government to fund 100 per cent of the LRT Extension into downtown Brampton and the Queen Street – Highway 7 BRT projects. RRL Pilot Program Update

In late February, more than 7,000 households joined Mayor Patrick Brown and Council members for a Tele Town Hall focused on the City of Brampton's Residential Rental Licensing Pilot Program. Residents participated in a lively discussion to better understand the program and share their feedback on the two-year pilot, which would require property owners with up to four residential rental units in select City Wards to register for a business licence. The majority of respondents (83 per cent) polled agree the City should crack down on illegal Additional Residential Units and take measures to ensure neighbourhoods are safe. Council will approve new criteria for the pilot program this spring. To look for an update, visit **brampton.ca/rrl**.





Feeding Wildlife is Prohibited

Under the Animal Services By-Law, feeding wildlife is prohibited in Brampton. Store your garbage, green bin and recycling boxes inside a garage, shed or away from fences/rails that can be easily climbed by animals. Place your garbage out for collection only on the scheduled day of pick up, no later than 7 am.



Fire Safety Tips

Brampton Fire and Emergency Services wants to help ensure Brampton residents protect their home, loved ones and spring memories from the impacts of fire. Make sure to:

- Install working smoke and carbon monoxide alarms.
- Create a home escape plan with your family.
- Stay in the kitchen while cooking.
- Only use barbecue grills outdoors, positioned away from combustible objects.
